Our bylaws require the periodic election of new officers. Our next elections will be on Sunday, January 8, 2017, from 5 pm to 7 pm at our Intergroup meeting at Newton Wellesley Hospital (Directions on our web site).

Being an officer is a great way to be of service. You will learn about the Intergroup and be a part of the service it provides to our fellowship. Come to find out about being an officer and participate in the election. Even if you decide being an officer is not right for you, you can represent your local meeting by voting. A description of the duties of each position is on the NEI website by searching for bylaws.

We will be electing:

- Telephone Coordinator (6 month sobriety requirement)
- Activities Chairperson

STEP & TRADITION OF THE MONTH

STEP 12: Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to sex and love addicts and to practice these principles in all areas of our lives.

TRADITION 12: Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

12th Step – What is Service?

Over the last few days I had difficulty finding the words to write about the 12th Step. I realized I was hiding out and only doing things that made me feel comfortable. It is an empty feeling. Then recently I received an invitation to service which I accepted. I realized that lately I had been stingy with accepting service in my life. The truth for me is that my life when I'm being "of service" is different than when I'm not. It has a different flavor, I have different feelings and different outcomes. Life is simply more fulfilling when I say "yes" to service.

Generally speaking, the 12th step is about service. But the question is: What is service? For me service started when I shared myself at my first meeting. Sharing ourselves and contributing to others is what service is all about. It is very easy to do. We all do it naturally.

To "Twelve Step" someone is to introduce them to our fellowship and start them on their program. This is done by people with sobriety and who have completed the 12 Steps at least once. I am on my 9th step and have never formally "12 Stepped" someone. I do share my experience with others in the fellowship and I know this helps because they have told me. Many of us also do more formal types of service. We volunteer to chair a meeting, write an entry for our newsletter or take a leadership role with Fellowship Wide Services. I also find these types of service to be very rewarding. However, one type of service is not better than another. Setting up chairs for a meeting makes just as big a difference as chairing one.

The second part of the 12th Step encourages us to "practice these principles in all areas of our lives." I have found this necessary as I have more sobriety on my "S" related bottom-line behavior. I am an addict and will always be one. But I look for relief in many different ways. I find myself overeating, over-exercising, seeking approval in others, etc... all so that I don't have to feel. It is important for me to apply these Steps to those areas too. I don't need to look for ways to hide from my life.
