New "Queer- and Trans-Affirming" S.L.A.A. Meeting in Somerville on Saturdays from 6-7pm, All Welcome

"Queer SLAAW" is a new meeting that launched in November. It's held at the U.C.C. Church, 89 College Ave., in Somerville on Saturday nights from 6-7pm.

The organizers stressed that the meeting is open to all who have the desire to stop living out a pattern of sex and love addiction – the program's Third Tradition. What is different at this meeting, however, is that when participants introduce themselves by first name, they are asked to also share their pronouns. Organizers explained that this is one aspect of what it means to be queer- and trans-affirming: not assuming another's gender or sexual identity.

Organizers further explained that for those who identify as queer or transgender, having a safe, understanding place where there's a higher likelihood that people may feel seen and heard by others who are queer, trans, and also in S.L.A.A. can be refreshing. And reassuring. And empowering.

Even when S.L.A.A. meetings are welcoming and affirming, there can be the barrier of being misunderstood through lack of understanding. Rather than the default being to have to explain their experience to the majority culture, this meeting operates on the premise that those attending the meeting have put the effort into becoming queer- and trans-affirming.

"So while not every person that comes through our halls is queer or trans, the expectation is you understand and accept," explained one of the organizers. "Whoever you are, you can be yourself here."

NEI bylaws may change to allow for more flexibility in setting sobriety requirements for elected positions

The merits of removing sobriety requirements for elected positions from the bylaws has been an ongoing discussion at recent NEI meetings.
